We will also be holding an AAHABC Community Show in mid-July (tentatively booked for July 14th, 2007). For many years now Arabian horse owners around the country have asked for an affordable Arabian show venue where the novice can test his or her skill and where the local Amateur owner can compete with other Arabian enthusiasts at an affordable level outside of the Class A and Regional competitions.

Now, as a result of the establishment of the Arabian Horse Association and a streamlined process for launching new programs, AHA has developed a new show venue: "Arabian Community Shows (ACS)".

The basic concepts include:

- Affordability to encourage the fun of showing rather than qualifying.
- General guidelines that allow for a more flexible rules requirement.
- A primary focus on Arabians, Half-Arabians and Anglo-Arabians registered with the Arabian Horse Association Registry or the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry.
- Year-end High-point program that creates recognition for top achievement by category and value for the horse.
- A Milestone award program that recognizes personal achievements and tracking of an individual's progress.
- 40% of the classes offered are Open Breed

The Marchador - The National Horse of Brazil

BREED INFORMATION:

The National Horse of Brazil, the Marchador averages about 15 H in height and is of medium build. They come in many colors: bay, black, buckskin, chestnut, grey, palomino, pinto, roan and more. Every horse has been bred for centuries to a high standard set in Brazil for conformation, gait and temperament AND IT SHOWS!!

If you are just beginning to ride, their easy-going nature and smooth gait inspires confidence and makes you look good. If you are an experienced rider, their endurance, soundness and enthusiasm to learn, means virtually any riding discipline can be pursued.

Regardless of your desires, the Marchador's beauty and people-loving personality will win your heart. The Brazilians say "ONE BREED, ONE PASSION".

Glowing endorsements have been written about the Marchador, many in Portuguese, but more recently in English with the International Encyclopedia of Horse Breeds and the Fabulous Floating Horses. This is what Bonnie Hendricks writes:

"This is without a doubt one of the most outstanding horse breeds in the world."

"Training of this breed is facilitated by its intelligence, and uses for the breed are unlimited. In work with cattle, in sports, in functional trials now performed as part of the official calendar of the ABCCMM, or in cross-country horsemanship, the Marchador is outstanding and is obtaining excellent results in comparison to other breeds. This breed is extremely docile and is commonly mounted by children."

HISTORY:

Of ancient Iberian bloodlines, the Marchador horse developed in Brazil during the 1800s after Royal horses were shipped to Brazil after Napoleon invaded. The Royal Ater stallion Sublime, was crossed with Andalusian, Criollo, Barbs and most importantly the smooth Spanish Jennet, which is now extinct, to produce the modern Marchador horse.

Historically, each farm produced a heritage and a bloodline that identified their horses. The horse's name always includes the breeding farm as part of the name. Some of older farm names and bloodlines are listed below. Mangalarga was one of the first farms during which the horses gained popularity, hence the adoption of Mangalaraga Marchador. The breeding farms kept impeccable written records so the history of many present-day Marchadors can be traced back 20 generations or more. The breed continues to be developed and improved today with many more new farms and breeders in Brazil. Many new farms incorporate combinations of several bloodlines to produce their future champions.

Abaiba Bloodline

Abaiba is synonymous with wonderful head and neck. Usually elegant and eye catching, they possess Arabian-like beauty. A line that has been predominately grey. Established in 1890.

Other farms such as A.J. Sama, Rima, Providencia, Santana and Maripa are based on the Abaiba bloodlines. Many of these bloodlines are famous in their own right.

Herdade Bloodline

Herdade (1905) was a very prolific line with a number of their stallions in demand. So in the days before AI and embryos, Herdade is often in the background of other lines that are emerging. With beautiful heads, they are also consistently show a smooth gait.

Newer Farms such as as H.B, H.O., Santa Lucia, Tosana are based on Herdade bloodlines.

Favacho Bloodline

One of the oldest bloodlines (1805), Favacho horses are still winning championships in Brazil. A compact, well-proportioned horse with a beautiful marcha, Favacho is always a good addition as a riding horse or in a breeding program.

Tabatinga Bloodline

The most Andalusian-like line of the Marchadors, Tabatinga horses always mean power in the back end They show an abundance of energy and enthusiasm in their work.

Newer Farms such as Rancho Apache and Joatinga are based on Tabatinga bloodlines.

BREED CHARACTERISTICS

General Appearance

The general appearance of the Mangalarga Marchador is characterized by medium structure, strong and well proportioned, with agility, vigor and soundness. The breed is light with fine, smooth skin. This horse has an active, but docile temperament.

The legs are muscular on both the outside and the inside, strong, long and straight, with short cannons. They have strong tough hooves and do well "barefoot" in many terrains.

The Head and Neck

The head is triangular (not concave) with a large, flat forehead tapering to a small, fine muzzle: straight profile . Large, soft, dark eyes which are set wide apart and extremely vivacious. The ears are proportional to the head, mobile, parallel and well set – erect, with the tips turned inward.

The neck, arched and well muscled, is in proportion to the head, with ideal insertion into the body. Withers are well defined, high and prominent, with good insertion into the neck and back.

The Chest and Back

The chest is deep, long and muscular and not prominent; the back is of medium length, straight and muscular; the loins are short, straight and well proportioned; if the distance from the back to the loins is of lesser or equal distance to the length of the croup, it is a sign that the horse possesses excellent conformation.

The Hindquarters

The hind quarters are symmetrical, well proportioned, and muscular; the croup is slightly sloping and long. The tail is set at a medium height, with a short, fine dock pointed down, but slightly raised when the animal moves, very elevated when excited.

THE GAIT

You say tamato and I say tomato”.

Some Marchador horses are predominately lateral gaited (PICADA- pi-ca-dah) and some are predominately diagonal gaited (BATIDA- ba-chi-da). There are opinions that one is better than another. Some horses can do both gaits or be trained to perform both.

The real question is -- are they smooth? You can find smooth, rhythmic gait in either lateral or diagonal horses. The smoothest horses are ones that have three feet on the ground more often. This can be felt by the rider, seen on slow videotape or by analysis of a recording of the hoofbeats.

There are differences between horses, so riding is encouraged to find your perfect horse. However, even the roughest Marchador is still easy to sit and enjoy as compared to a true trotting or pacing horse.



HIGH POINT PROGRAM

The Region 17 High Point has been developed to recognize and encourage the continued participation of members of Region 17 at our Horse Shows.

Divisions

High Point Arabian
High Point Part Arabian/Anglo Arabian
High Point Amateur Rider
High Point Junior Rider

1. A Champion, Reserve Champion, and Top 5 will be awarded in each division. We will be awarding special awards to the winners.
2. Points will be calculated from January 1 to December 31. Class calculations and show records must be submitted from the Arabian Horse Association Web site. It is the owner's responsibility to send in the records by the deadline, December 31 of the current year, starting in 2006.
3. A special presentation will be made at the Spring Regional Meeting. Winners will be notified and will be encouraged to attend.
4. Only Region 17 Shows are to count including Class A Region 17 Arabian Shows, Western Canadian Breeders and Canadian Nationals.
5. High Point participant must be a member of a Region 17 Club, and a resident of Region 17.
6. The High Point Purebred and High Point Part bred/Anglo Arabian will be calculated from all Open Classes (including Maiden, Novice, Jr. Horse etc). Amateur and junior, handler or rider classes not to count. More than one combination may be submitted.
7. The High Point Amateur Rider and High Point Junior Rider will be calculated with 1 Rider & 1 Horse combinations. Amateur, Junior Equitation and Showmanship classes to count. Points earned in Open classes not to count for these awards. More than 1 combination may submitted by the owner or rider. Rider does not necessarily need to be the owner of the horse.
8. All exhibitors entering Region 17 High Point are assumed to have knowledge and understanding of the above rules and point system.

POINT SYSTEM

Class A Shows

Regular Classes

1 point for every horse that you beat (total number of horses in the class) Points calculated up to 6 placings.

Championship Classes:

2 points for every horse you beat. Points calculated up to 6 placings.

Regional Classes & Western Canadian Breeders

4 Points for every horse that you beat, (total number of horses in the class).Points calculated for the Top 5 Horses at Regionals and Top 6 horses at Western Canadian Breeders.

Canadian Nationals.

6 points for every horse that you beat (total # of horses in the class). Points calculated for the Top 10.

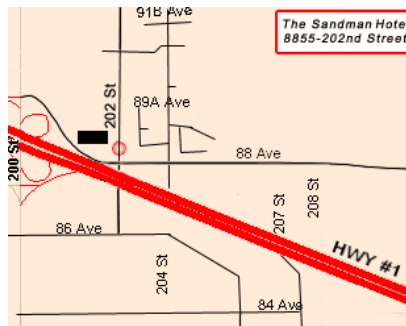


